Processes for Learning

All subject learning requires the attainment of knowledge, skills and processes. Unfortunately in most curriculum documents, only knowledge and skills are explicitly identified. The exclusion of 'processes' has significant implications on the quality of the thinking and learning outcomes achieved by our students. Truly successful learning requires knowledge and skills but also the mastery of a diversity of learning processes. Effective problem solving is promoted through the use of a problem solving process; quality writing is enhanced through the use of a publishing process; the ability to engage in effective and valid investigation is improved through the use of an investigation learning process.; and the use of a technology process can advance the capacity to produce innovative products.

When learning processes are framed into 'models', learners are provided with a conceptualisation of the 'whole' while focussing their attention on the relevant 'parts'. Confusion and incomplete thinking are avoided; quality is promoted; self-direction, responsibility, accountability and autonomy are explicitly facilitated. What if your learners were empowered with processes for learning?

In this two day workshop you will...

- explore a diversity of processes for learning along with student exemplars that demonstrate their power and use
- explore the learning jobs associated with each specific process so that you can infuse each process in subject specific and cross-curricular ways
- develop knowledge and understanding of the relationships between a process for learning and its associated criteria and planners
- explore processes, criteria and planners that have been developed at a diversity of developmental levels
- learn how to manipulate processes and associated criteria and planners to meet the specific level and needs of your learners
- explore how the use of learning processes can dramatically improve the ability to lock learning into long-term memory
- gain practical knowledge and understanding of processes for learning as you experience them for yourself
